Week-At-A-Glance

Literacy: We will read City Hawk the Story of Pale Male and students will be starting to form their opinion on what they think should happen to Pale Male's nest. We will sharing opinions all week. See if your child can determine whether statements are opinions or fact. For example, "Ice cream is the best dessert!" Fact or Opinion? In skills block we will be learning about the vowel "teams" "ay" and "ow" (like low). Please be sure to practice this with your child. Here's how we mark them to read. Math: We are learning about time this week. Students will learn to tell time on an analog and digital clock to the hour and half hour. This is great to practice at home. The most difficult is reading time to the half hour on an analog clock. Be sure they can tell you what "hour" the clock is showing. Social Studies: Students will begin to earn "money" for the jobs they do at school as well as learn about supply and demand in real ways. For example, how much will it cost for a pencil with an eraser? Very scarce in our classroom! They will also have to pay to replace a lost dry erase marker. They earn money everyday for: being at school, turning in their folder, and doing their classroom job. They will have an opportunity to shop on Fridays.


