Week-At-A-Glance

Literacy: During morning literacy time students will engage in meaningful activities related to career week (more information in What's Happening on page 2). In skills, students will be introduced to using suffix endings -s, -ed, and -ing with CVCe words. Students will learn how adding suffix endings to base words changes the definition of the word.

Math: We will be completing assessments on Monday and Tuesday related to addition and subtraction word-problems and place-value. On Wednesday, we will start learning about 2D and 3D shapes. Students will be detectives and go on a shape-hunt in the classroom to find real life examples of 3D shapes.

Science: Let's explore rocks! We will learn about rocks and their different properties including, size, color, texture, and more. Students will bring home a small plastic bag on Monday to fill with different rocks from home.

Positivity Project: Perspective and Communication: You appreciate that people see things in different ways. You have the ability to understand view.
