Week-At-A-Glance

Literacy: In skills, students will be introduced to the "bossy "r". We will learn how r-controlled vowels can change a vowel sound, focusing this week specifically on -ar and -er words.

Math: This week we will be continuing our focus on 2D and 3D shapes. At the beginning of the week students will learn about defining vs. nondefining attributes of 2D shapes and get practice with drawing 2D shapes when given a defining attribute. Students will be completing their Unit 6 Assessment 1 on Thursday which asks them to draw shapes given a shape attribute. On Friday, we will shift our focus from 2D to 3D shapes while students learn about defining attributes including faces, vertices, edges, and more.

Science: Let's explore soil and plants! We will learn about the needs of a plant including air, sunlight, water, nutrients, and more. Students will get the opportunity to complete multiple science experiments focusing on learning about the different types of soil, soil layers of the earth, and how neglecting to provide essential elements for plants can impact their growth.

Positivity Project: Humor: You like to laugh and bring smiles to other people. **Habit 7: Sharpen the saw.** Balance feels best.
