Week-At-A-Glance

Literacy:

This week we will start Cycle 5. We will be finishing up our focus on each of the short vowel sounds as we tackle the letter e. E and I are tough sounds for students to hear. Please be sure to practice the words and reading the high-frequency words as well for our assessment on Friday.

Math: We will begin to learn about numbers larger than 20. We will talk about decade numbers. These are the numbers that are multiples of 10 (10, 20, 30, ...90). We will connect this with place value and show the value of the decade number with ten sticks. This is the foundation for understanding 2 digit numbers.

Social Studies: We will be focusing on rules and our class and school community. This comes at a good place in our year and the students get more comfortable with the expectations and with each other.


