Do you know what rude, mean and bullying behaviors are?

Rude: Inadvertently saying or doing something that hurts someone **Mean:** Purposefully saying or doing something to hurt someone once or twice. It is not a pattern of behavior.

Bullying Behavior (much more serious): Deliberate behavior that is repeated over time and meant to hurt someone. Bullying behaviors are repeated, intentional and intimidating (there is a power differential– one person has all the power and other has none).

Please note that we don't call people "Bully" but that they are showing "bullying behavior(s)." At Green, none of these behaviors are OK. We choose to show kindness. Please tell your child to let me know if they feel like someone is being rude, mean or showing bullying behaviors. Have a great week!

Literacy:


This week the students will finish working with their team to create their magnificent moving thing. They will start to write about their magnificent moving thing and how they created it with tools. Students will be learning about words with the short vowel i sound. Be sure to practice at home. You will find high-frequency words every week. Please practice these words at home. These words are usually difficult for students to read.

Math: We will continue to use circle drawings to show our thinking. This week we will focus on subtraction. Did your child show you how to count on and use a break apart stick? Ask him/her. We will also work with numberless word problems. This helps students focus on the context of the word problem rather than focus only on the numbers. 1st graders tend to add number together no matter what the word problem is about.

Positivity Project/Leadership: Forgiveness

You forgive those who have done wrong. You accept that people make mistakes.

Habit 5: Seek first to understand, then to be understood. I listen before I talk

Math Strategies

We have worked on two math strategies so far: Make A Ten and counting on. Ask your child to show you how to do this. I am sending a double ten frame so your child can show you this one. They can use cereal, pennies or any small item to use for counters.

We also learned about the counting on strategy and we will learn how to count back as well. Students show their thinking by drawing circles and using a break apart stick. The have also learned to count on from the first number. Counting back isn't as easy for the students, so crossing out the circles is much easier.
