## **Teacher-to-Parents**

Dear Parents,

We are almost to the point that students can work independently when I am working with other students. This isn't an easy task, try to imagine getting 14 students to work quietly on the right thing while you work with 1 student. They will have to do this for as long as 30 minutes for literacy and 30 minutes for Math while I work with a small group of students. You can practice this at home. When your child works on something at home, you should be able to walk away from your child and he or she should be able to continue to work.

On this note, I want to talk with you about homework. Wake County suggests 1st graders have 20 minutes of homework at night. Our homework consists of one important thing-read to your child and have your child read to you. Then, talk to your child about what he/she read. After that, spend time doing things what we can't do at school: go on a nature walk, play a game, do physical activity together, play at a playground, or cook together. Most children would benefit from this far more than doing another worksheet at home.

Thank you for your patience! Our assistants have been out recently which means less hands at school. These means it takes a while to get things done. Just a reminder, please call the office if you have changes to transportation. This is the best way to ensure I get the message.

#### Literacy:

We continue to learn about tools and we will read a fiction book called "The Little Red Pen". 
## ☑ Bring a water bottle to school
